Details:

- * Get your canvas(es) stamped; then find your spot and **begin painting at 8:30 a.m.**
- * **At 11:30 a.m., bring your work up to the patio area.**
- * You will have until **12:00 noon** to frame your work and hang it on the grids provided. **Judging and award presentation will take place at 12:00 noon.**
- * Stay for lunch - provided by SOCALPAPA.
- * You may leave your paintings on exhibit and for sale in the Muth Center over the weekend, **Saturday and Sunday, July 14 & 15** *. All sales will be handled by NBC with 35% commission to NBC and 65% to artists.
- * Pick up unsold paintings on Tuesday, July 17. (Muth Center is closed on Mondays.)

Rules: **Few, but important!**

1. Get your canvas stamped. Unstamped canvas will not be accepted;
2. Bring frame and framing supplies; paintings must be ready to hang;
3. Oil, water color, acrylic, or pastel only.
4. Subject Matter – Newport Beach Back Bay only – any view;
5. Bring your work to the Muth Center on time – paintings not framed and hung on grids by 12:00 noon will not be accepted for judging;
6. All sales to be handled by NBC; 35% commission to NBC; 65% to the artist;
7. Pick up unsold paintings from Muth Center on Tuesday, July 17
