

2025-26 Naturalist Training

Schedule and Requirements Overview

Newport Bay Conservancy's Naturalist Training course has been offered annually since 1990 with the goal of providing volunteers interested in leading programs the knowledge they need to be able to do so successfully. The course features classes and field trips on a range of topics led by experts in their field as well as program-specific trainings to prepare volunteers to share their newfound knowledge with students and the public. Our Naturalists go on to guide public kayak and walking tours in the Bay, educate students from elementary school through college, lead restoration projects, and share our story with the broader community of our watershed.

DATES: This year's course runs from August 28, 2025 through June 4, 2026.

PREREQUISITE: For those not yet volunteers with us, the prerequisite for this course is Volunteer Orientation. You may choose to attend the full orientation on Saturday, August 23rd from 8:30am-3:30pm, or to attend a one-hour meeting in late Aug/early Sept and complete the orientation in the Spring.

COST: The course costs \$35 and includes a manual of reference materials. Refunds are not available after the second week of classes. If you decide to drop the course after the second week, your registration fees will be applied towards next year's training. NBC is pleased to offer four scholarships to people from diverse groups in support of their participation in the 2025-2026 Naturalist Training. Interested in applying for a scholarship? TESTING: Short weekly quizzes are administered throughout the fall session to help you assess your understanding of key topics. At the end of the fall session, each trainee will present a program idea. The spring session will include collaboration with other trainees to run a new program.

TRAINING COMPONENTS: Training consists of 2 components: Knowledge Acquisition and Skills-Building & Practice. The Knowledge Acquisition Component takes place primarily in the fall, while the Skills Building & Practice Component spans from fall through spring.

1. **Knowledge Acquisition Component**

From August 28th through December 6th, 2025, class meets on Thursday evenings and Saturdays. Thursday evening lectures will be from 6-8pm, presented via Zoom with closed captioning. Saturday class times and locations vary. All Saturday classes will be presented in-person only, a mix of indoors and outdoors. The fall season concludes with a holiday party on Saturday, December 13, 2025 from 1-3pm.

ATTENDANCE: *Attendance and participation in the activities is vital to ensure that you have the breadth and depth of knowledge necessary for our naturalists. Therefore, if you miss any Thursday meetings, you will be expected to watch the recording of the session. If you miss any Saturday meetings it is important that you speak with the program administrator as soon as possible to discuss how to make up missed material to complete your training. In cases where a participant encounters significant emergencies/challenges that prevent them attending more than 3 Saturday meetings, we may ask them to complete the training the following year.*

2. **Skills-Building & Practice Component**

Trainees are expected to attend at least two 4-part trainings (8 meetings total), including shadowing selected programs which can begin as early as fall, with trainings and followup meetings in spring. Trainees also work collaboratively in groups to develop and run a new program.

GRADUATION: Training concludes with a celebration on June 4, 2026 from 6-8pm, during which graduates receive Newport Bay Naturalist name badges and certificates.

Spring 2026 Naturalist Training Schedule & Requirements

Skills-Building & Practice Component

1. **Program Trainings:** Each trainee must **complete at least two (2)** of the following training options. For each option, trainees will need to attend a program or related training, shadow a scheduled program between October and March, attend a discussion/debrief meeting in late March or early April, and shadow or co-lead a scheduled program between April and May. Trainees must complete all 4 components in a series to receive credit. Meeting dates below will be tentatively set by the end of August and will be confirmed by the beginning of December.

2. **Program Design & Implementation:** Each trainee will propose a spring program idea at the end of the fall session. Top programs will be selected and trainees will work in groups to produce these programs in the spring. This will include:
 - Five meetings with staff (Education Manager and/or Education Specialist)
 - Meeting 1, Thu, 1/8/26, 6-8pm: review proposal & receive guidance on next steps
 - Meeting 2, Thu, 3/12/26 (6-7pm or 7-8pm): progress check-in
 - Meeting 3, Thu, 5/7/26 (6-7pm or 7-8pm): confirm last remaining action items
 - Meeting 4 (30min): final check-in scheduled 1 week before your program date
 - Meeting 5 (30min): debrief scheduled within 1 week after your program date
 - Group members will work together to...
 - Determine ideal audience and how to recruit participants/attendees
 - Clarify and develop the curriculum & talking points
 - Obtain and/or create materials for any activities
 - Schedule a date for the program
 - Create flyers and advertising to potential participants/attendees
 - Train other volunteers on curriculum/activities if necessary

NOTE: If these requirements would pose personal or logistical challenges, alternative options can be discussed with the program administrator, such as additional volunteer shifts, committee involvement, or other projects.
