








Weed Warrior Program

- ~48 entries, 12 species; ~3,394 m² of infested area mapped



Maturing our finance capabilities

2024 2025 2026

- "Business as usual" year while we grew, the scale of
 our fundraising and
 operations was in line with
 how we have historically
 operated
- While we operated at an accounting loss, we were able to manage our cash flow and complete work on our programs and large grant projects
- 2024 FY books were closed recently - we will file our Form 990 (tax return) by 11/15 after receiving an extension

- Entering new period of growth
- Big Canyon Phase 3 puts
 us into a new category of financial complexity requiring preparation
- Working with a consultant (former nonprofit CFO) to create new financial systems and structure better suited to current operations
- Preparing for 2025
 year-end and beginning
 of audit process

- Continued growth driven by BCP3
- Priority will be implementing new financial systems and structure beginning in 2025 and ensuring we fulfill obligations of grants and bill appropriately
- In parallel, will need to work with auditing firm to complete audit for 2025 and ensure we are prepared to be audited again for 2026

Key Revenue Updates:

- Donation revenue dipped slightly; timing of some major donations a factor
- Fundraising events in 2024 were a success - effort to begin to elevate GBTB that began in 2024 and continued in 2025 contributed
- Net gift shop sales also impacted by some timing factors (inventory acquisition, tax payments) vs. a major dip in sales

Key Expense Updates:

- Higher admin expense driven by artificially low 2023 (correcting a 2022 overpayment)
- Fundraising and development expense related to write-off of legacy inventory
- Payroll increased due to new headcount a good thing, given our programs have grown

Key Updates:

- Receivables nature of NBC's grant-funded operations is that we have long payment cycles; working to ensure we have the resources to make billing as efficient as possible, but this drives our high receivables
 - However, improved at billing vs.
 2023
- Inventory written off for 2024 moving to simpler inventory accounting system
- Reserve for accounting discrepancies as we work to make our financial systems align better to our operations, working on cleaning up the balance sheet accounts this is part of that process
