

- Removed six, 40-yard dumpsters of vegetation from the canyon, estimated to weigh almost 60,000 lbs
- Recorded more than 1,730 hours of support given by volunteers
- Planted 250 native plants throughout the canyon

Weed Warrior Program 2024

- Volunteers trained in mapping invasive species and collecting data using Field Maps application
- 324 observations, 25 species, ~2 acres of infested area documented
- Will start up again for the third season in 2025







Treasurer's Report


Highlights

2023-24:

- Continue to reconcile high revenues and expenses for 10 ongoing education and restoration grant projects.
- Wrapping up the state funding for the Big Canyon Phase II Restoration but the retainage (withholding 5-10%) makes it hard to manage cash flow which is dipping into our reserves.

2024-2025:


- Look to transition duties from current Treasurer to new Treasurer.
- Still need to build our reserves to \$250,000 or more to maintain our regular programming while taking on larger restoration projects.


ARTICLE V - BOARD OF DIRECTORS

Section 3. Term. The term of service for Board members shall be two three years, and shall start upon election at the annual meeting. The terms of half plus one of the Board members shall commence in even numbered years and the terms of the remaining members shall commence in odd numbered years. Board terms shall be staggered to have 1/3 of the Board members terms commencing at the annual meeting. No more than we three terms shall be served consecutively.

ARTICLE VI – OFFICERS

<u>Section 4. Term.</u> Officers shall serve a one-year term beginning immediately upon their election at the November meeting. No member may hold more than one office at a time. No member may be elected to office if their board term expires at the same time as their officer term. Board members are not precluded from serving as an officer during the last year of their board term contingent upon the officer committing to an additional board term.
